the chance to build an effective and vibrant economy, the opportunity to develop democratically and more. If something goes wrong, that is the result of bad choices, but having an opportunity to make a choice in the first place is already a great advantage."

He spoke about next year's Euro 2012 football competition and apart from the logistics involved with infrastructure and logistics he stated that it was important for the world to see Ukrainians who truly love their country, believe in it and are proud of it. In conclusion he stated, "It continues to be a great honour for me to have an opportunity to work for our Ukrainian Community in WA and for Ukraine and to do what we can to contribute to the development of this amazing nation."







The following concert included students from the Ukrainian Ethnic School of Taras Shevchenko reciting poetry; Rozhtiazhka Dancing Group performing two dances, Pryvit and Hopak; the W.A.
