We may not be with them on the front lines, but our actions can make all the difference to those who have answered the call to arms to defend Ukraine against Russia's tyranny and aggression.

How you can help

We are running a community campaign, complementing our broader advocacy strategy, targeting key political decision-makers and the people that influence them.

We are calling on the Commonwealth Government to provide more military aid to Ukraine and we need you to help reach out to Members of Parliament to join us and support our campaign.

Here's how you can help:

- Write to your Member of Parliament, and relevant Ministers, to share your story about how Russia's invasion of Ukraine has impacted you, and how important it is that Australia continues to support Ukraine with additional military aid.
- Call your Member of Parliament to tell them how important it is that Australia continues to support Ukraine in its time of need.
- Meet with your Member of Parliament to share your personal story about how Russia's invasion of Ukraine has impacted you, your family, your friends and your community.

Write to your local Member of Parliament

You can use our online tool on our website to easily write to your local Member of Parliament. It automatically finds your local Member of Parliament based on your postcode and includes important decision-makers including the Prime Minister, the Minister for Defence, the Minister for Foreign Affairs, and the Treasurer.

Your experience and story are powerful. Sharing your story with your local Member of Parliament helps demonstrate the importance of increasing support for Ukraine.

This year, Ukraine can achieve victory and peace, but it cannot do this without the support of its friends across the world.

Meet with your local Member of Parliament

Meeting with your local Member of Parliament is a great way to speak personally to your story and to show how important it is to support the Campaign for Ukraine.

Members of Parliament will generally only meet with their constituents. Each person has one Member of the House of Representatives (the Lower House), with twelve Senators (the Upper House) for each State and two for each Territory.

We can help you find out who your local Member of Parliament is, which Senators represent your jurisdiction, and their office addresses and contact details so you can make the best choice about who to meet with. Visit www.ozeukes.com/campaign-for-ukraine for help.

Depending on the position of the Member of Parliament and their various commitments including parliamentary sittings, it may be difficult for them to find a timeslot to meet with you in the short term. We recommend being patient and working closely with the staff to determine a suitable day and time to meet. Meetings would generally be no longer than 30 minutes but vary depending on the Member.

Before the meeting, we recommend:

- Thinking about what you would like to share with the Member of Parliament. Write
 down your story, and think about how you can articulate it to help them understand the
 impacts of the war on you, your family, friends and your community.
- Having the ask to support more military aid ready. Connect your personal story to why
 you are meeting with the Member, and why it is important that they support Ukraine
 more.
- Ask if you can be in a photo with them with your 'Stand with Ukraine' banner on
 the back of this booklet, and if you can share it on social media with the hashtag
 #CampaignForUkraine. Always ask permission before taking a photo and be clear
 about where you would be publishing it. We recommend the following caption:
 - I'm meeting with my [local Member of Parliament/Senator] [Name] about the #CampaignForUkraine, and why it is important to continue supporting Ukraine to achieve peace and victory. Find out more at www.ozeukes.com/campaign-for-ukraine

Call your local Member of Parliament

If it is difficult to meet with your local Member of Parliament, you can call their electorate office to talk about your personal story and ask for their support in calling for more military aid for Ukraine.

When contacting electorate offices, you will likely be speaking with a representative of the Member. You may want to consider speaking to them and asking:

- If you are able to book a time to speak with the Member of Parliament.
- If not, if you are able to book a time to meet with a staff member.
- If not, discuss briefly why you feel it is important to support more military aid to Ukraine and, if you have one, share your personal story.

Near the end of the discussion, ensure you ask your concerns be passed onto the Member of Parliament (if speaking to a staff member) and to the relevant Minister on your behalf.

You will most likely be asked to confirm your name and contact details including your residential address to confirm your constituency status and for the electorate office to provide any follow-up correspondence if necessary.

Always speak with respect and courtesy when engaging with electorate offices, and be mindful that Members of Parliament and their staff receive a high level of correspondence and incoming calls.

We have also set up an online form for you to contact your Members of Parliament directly. We recommend using this method as it automatically finds who your representatives are and contains pre-filled words that you may choose to edit.
